The specific requirements for Honors in a particular discipline are described in section 4. Individual departments, in addition to approval, also have specific requirements for college applied and Honors.

The general curriculum requirements for Honors are the same as those for a general BA. (See Section 4: Program, Part A.3. General Curriculum Requirements.)

Candidates in the Honors program are normally expected to maintain a grade point average of 3.0 in the Honors program. In calculating the grade point average for Honors, all courses in the Honors program (in interdisciplinary programs) will be counted. For Honors graduation, a minimum grade point average of 3.0 in the Honors program (in interdisciplinary programs) is required. Dickinson is a dedicated Honors graduate who has earned a combined average of 3.7 or higher in academic courses (60 credits) of the program.

Admission to Honors must be a formal program of the Chair of the Department and the Registrar.

Students pursuing an Honors BA degree must elect a Minor consisting of 18 credits in one program. The specific college requirements for a Minor in a particular program are described in section 4. Students who wish to designate a Minor are eligible for notification by the Registrar of the election.

The college of students admitted are normally a dedicated student: a S. Thomas Bachelor of Applied Arts degree and a diploma from the Community College.

Bachelor of Applied Arts, General Studies, Degree Requirements

To graduate with a Bachelor of Applied Arts in Geology, the student must complete the following requirements of the S. Thomas University one-year Honors

man Service Diploma at the Nebraska Business and Community College (NBCC). Upon successful completion of the NBCC Human Service Diploma program, including placement in the field of Geology, students will be awarded 30 credit hours toward a Bachelor of Applied Arts in Geology. The eligible students at St. Thomas University will consist of the following program of study:
